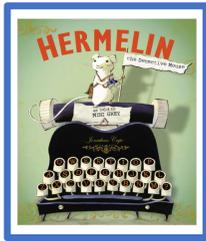

Grammar	
noun	they name people, place and things
conjunctions	words used to extend sentences; when, if, that, but, because, and
adjective	a word that can be used before a noun, for example - some really good work, or after a verb, for example - their work was good
noun phrase	a group of words to describe - a blue butterfly or the man in the moon
prefix	added to the beginning of a word to create a new word - for example kind - unkind, happy - unhappy
endings	Adding 's' and 'es' to words - if the ending sounds like 's' or 'z' it is spelt as -s. If the ending sounds like 'iz' it is spelt -es.
verb	a word to describe an action or tells us something is happening
question	a sentence that asks you something and ends with a question mark - ?

Vocabulary	
detective	A person whose job is to investigate and solve crimes
typewriter	A machine with keys that types numbers or letters one at a time
pest	An annoying person or thing, or a destructive animal
hurl	To throw with force
suspects	A person thought to be guilty of a crime
mysteries	Something that is difficult or impossible to explain
clues	A piece of evidence used to detect a crime
reward	A thing given in recognition for service or effort
adventurous	Willing to take risks or try something new
solve	To find an answer or explanation for something
thrilled	A sudden feeling excitement
residents	A person who lives somewhere permanently or long term
injured	Harmed or damaged
invitation	A written or verbal request inviting someone to go somewhere
