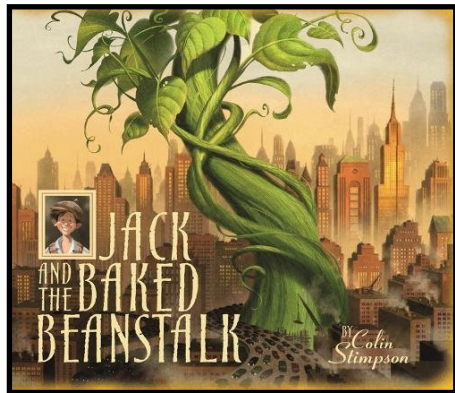

Grammar, Punctuation and Language Features		
alliteration	the repetition of a letter or sound	<i>big beanstalk</i>
conjunctions	words used to extend or join sentences together	<i>when, if, that, but, because, and, so, while</i>
exclamations !	a sentence with a strong emotion or feeling ending with !	<i>How brilliant is this! What an amazing trip!</i>
questions ?	a sentence where you ask a question and use a ?	<i>Can you help me Jack?</i>
apostrophes for contraction '	used to join two words together, replacing the missing letters	<i>it + is = it's should + not = shouldn't</i>
past tense	writing about events that have already happened	<i>Jack and his mum lived and worked in a burger van.</i>
adverbials of time	tell us how or when something happened	<i>Later on, Soon after, Suddenly, Meanwhile</i>
compound words	two or more words are joined to make a new word	<i>sun + flower = sunflower cup + cake = cupcake</i>

dreadful	very bad or scary.
isolated	all alone, far away from others
summary	a short way of telling a story or information
magnificent	very beautiful or amazing
entire	the whole of something, not just a part
doorstep	the step outside a door.

money	coins or notes used to buy things
parents	a mother and father who take care of you
gold	a shiny yellow metal that is very valuable
plant	a living thing that grows in the ground
water	a liquid that we drink and need to live
poor	having very little or not enough money
