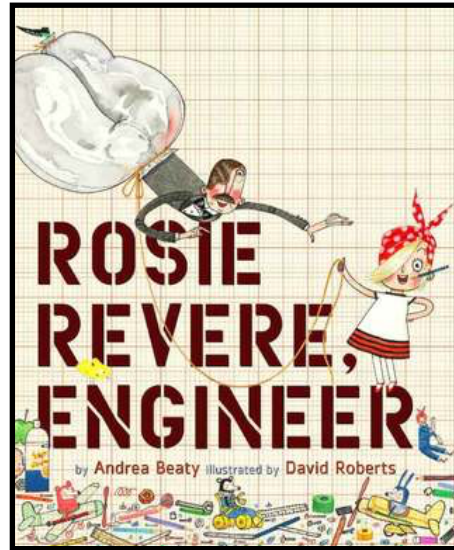

noun phrases	group of words describe the noun (determiner + adjective + noun)	<i>the baffled girl an amazing cockpit</i>
conjunctions	words used to join or extend sentences	<i>when, if, that, but, because, and, so, while, whilst</i>
apostrophe for possession	used to tell us something belongs to someone	<i>Rosie's invention The engineer's stash</i>
bullet points	used to separate items on a list; these can be either full sentences or single words	<i>You will need: • Scissors • Glue</i>
imperative verbs	known as "bossy" verbs - they command someone to do something	<i>Get, Pick up, Cut, Find</i>

Common Exception Words	
beautiful	very pretty or pleasing to look a
break	to separate into pieces or stop working; also means a short rest
could	used to show possibility or past ability
improve	to make something better
many	a large number of something
only	just one or no more than what is needed

Invention narrative	A story about an invention, usually with five parts - think about all the possibilities!
Explanation	Explanations are written to make something very clear to the reader.
